EYE PROTECTION ADJUSTED TO YOUR EYESIGHT

Some instructions must be followed by your optometrist before the use of eye protection adapted to your eyesight can be approved. We highly recommend bringing this memo to your optometry clinic.



SECOND WAVE

Considering that the CISSS de la Côte-Nord now has a designated COVID-19 centre (Hôpital de Sept-Îles), we find it important to remind you of a few things.

Basic measures to follow at all times

- Wash your hands before and after seeing a user
- Wear a procedure mask adequately at all times except during meal time in the break room
- Wear eye protection

Contamination risk

- During meals, when the two-metre distancing rule is not respected
- Between employees who share food at the station
- · When there is relaxation in hand washing

Remember to respect the procedures to dress and undress in warm and hot zones, and to wear the adequate personal protective equipment (PPE).


REMINDER: TRAVELLING TO OTHER REGIONS

If you are considering travelling outside the North Shore, you must respect certain measures, which apply to all resources who work at the CISSS de la Côte-Nord. Resources that plan to travel to other regions are invited to communicate with the Health, safety and quality of work life department by calling 1 833 755-0668 in order to receive the appropriate recommendations based on the region they are visiting.

For resources (employees, physicians, independent workers, pharmacists and other critical workers)

- No self-isolation upon return;
- Testing at days zero and seven;
- Follow-up by the Health, safety and quality of work life department.

For interns and resident physicians, specific rules apply, following ministerial recommendations. The Health, safety and quality of work life department will inform you of

It is important to quickly recognize the signs and symptoms, to put preventive measures in place as quickly as possible.


Basic practices:

- ⇒ Wash your hands before and after contact with a user and their environment
- ⇒ Clean all devices shared by users
- ⇒ Wear a procedure mask at all times
- ⇒ Wear a face-shield or protective goggles when within two metres of a user
- ⇒ Follow respiratory etiquette
- ⇒ Cough into the crook of your elbow
- ⇒ Wash your hands after blowing your nose

A successful simulation in Sept-Îles!



On October 22nd, the simulation of a positive COVID-19 case that took place at the Hôpital de Sept-Îles was a success, from the prehospital service to the hospitalization (designated zone in hospitalization). For the prehospital service, an additional team was present to handle the simulation. For the nursing services at the emergency and hospitalization levels, two people are dedicated to providing care in the event of a high bed occupancy rate. On the medical side, a physician was on duty, so service to the population was not compromised. This whole process allowed us to confirm the effectiveness of our infection prevention and control (IPC) measures and our service trajectories. Thank you to everyone involved in the preparation of this simulation and in the simulation itself. Bravo everyone!

Audits were carried out in designated screening clinics (DSCs) in the last few weeks, in Baie-Comeau and Havre-Saint-Pierre, among others. The infection prevention and control advisors responsible for the visits noted several improvements and positive elements. Staff members were adequately following procedures to avoid risks of contaminations, and the documentation was correctly placed and clean.
