# **VACCINATION OF HEALTH CARE WORKERS**



Vaccination against COVID-19 is **expanded to more health care workers**. Workers identified as being part of phase 2 of group 2 are now invited to register. In Québec, workers of the health and social services network who are in contact with users are part of priority group 2 for vaccination. This group is divided into two phases.

Here is an extract of the directive of the ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux that specifies which workers are targeted in the current vaccination phase (you can consult the whole directive in French here):

Phase 2 - The health care workers prioritized in this phase are those who provide care and services in the following sectors:

- ⇒ Staff members (employees, physicians and interns) of health and social services establishments and the people in charge of IR-FTRs who were not targeted in phase 1 are included. For example, those who provide services in all clinical missions and programs for all living environments, residential environments and health care settings: employees who provide clinical services in youth, ID-PD, mental health, public health, SAPA and DPJ programs, as well as other clinical services.
- ⇒ Health care professionals (including interns) in **private clinics**, such as dental clinics, psychology clinics, optometry clinics, FMGs, private medical clinics, physiotherapy clinics, pharmacies (including technical staff), hearing care clinics, etc., are included in this phase.
- ⇒ Community workers who are in direct contact with high-risk patients, street workers in mental health, homelessness and addiction, for example, are included in this phase.

Please note that health and social services workers from administrative and support sectors, including human resources and financial resources, as well as employees from the maintenance sector, will be vaccinated based on their age, along with the population. The same applies to employees of all directions of the CISSS who do not provide care or services to users.

# **DISCLOSURE: CLARIFICATION**

In the last INFO-CISSS, we mentioned that when an accident happens during the provision of services to users, they must be informed of it. The Direction des services multidisciplinaires, qualité, évaluation, performance et éthique (DSMQEPE) would like to clarify a few things:

Home care	Any event <b>that happens in the presence of a professional</b> must be reported. In any other situation, write a note in the file.	
Repeated event	Assault between users, self-harm, repetitive falls, runaway, etc. <b>Beforehand:</b> Evaluation of the risk for the user and intervention plan based on that risk.  Only report the event if the intervention plan was not respected or if the consequences are different or worse than expected. A note must be made in the user's file to justify the application of the intervention plan.	
Self-medication	The user is under the responsibility of the establishment. Events related to the failure to respect self-medication must be reported (establishment).	
Application of control measures	The only events related to control measures that must be reported in the Système d'information sur la sécurité des soins et des services (SISSS) are physical or psychological injuries resulting from the application of control measures (isolation, or physical, mechanical or chemical restraint).	
Event with partners	Community pharmacy, paratransit, ambulance, etc. Report the event when it is noticed by the establishment that granted the service contract. The establishment must inform the partner.	
Event affecting several users, but for which the potential consequences are unknown	<ul> <li>Equipment problem, computer system problem, Health Canada recalls and safety alerts, problem with manufacturers or other suppliers, etc. The MSSS recommends:</li> <li>1) That the event be reported as a high-risk situation and that a single global AH-223-1 form be completed and kept by the risk manager;</li> <li>2) That a register including the list of potentially affected users (file number) be made in order to ensure the traceability, follow-up and effective management of this event;</li> <li>3) That an AH-223-1 report form be completed and filed in the record of each user who has suffered consequences from this event.</li> </ul>
