
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### **VARIANTS IN THE REGION: BE VIGILANT!**

### NEW DOCUMENTS RELATED TO THE USE OF THE N95 MASK

Following the new recommendation of the CNESST to wear an N95 mask in the presence of a warm user:

- Procedure to put on and remove the N95 mask for an extended use or to reuse it (French only)
- Reusability management for the N95 mask (French only)
- Recommendation on the use of the N95 mask in warm zone based on the directive of the CNESST (French only)
- Recommendation on the use of the N95 mask in the presence of a user who tested positive for COVID-19 based on the directive of the CNESST (French only)

### IPC RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FAMILY CAREGIVERS IN HOT ZONES

Here is the proper course of action for family caregivers visiting hot zones. In the absence of a zone as a unit (a room only, for example), the user's room is considered hot. Here are four documents to consult:

- Leaflet for family caregivers Procedure (French only)
- Directives for family caregiver visits in hot zones (French only)
- Consent form for the family caregiver who will support a relative in a hot zone (French only)
- Family caregiver attendance record (hot zone) (French only)

# AGIR TÔT - FOLLOW-UP ON THE PILOT PROJECT IN HAUTE-CÔTE-NORD

The **Agir Tôt pilot project for 0-5-year-olds** has been in place in Haute-Côte-Nord since January 25<sup>th</sup>. Virtual information meetings were offered to the employees concerned and targeted external partners in order to explain the Agir Tôt developmental screening program. Moreover, in order to reach as many potential referrers as possible, an audiovisual recording was made and emailed to everyone involved directly or indirectly with this age group.

With the number of requests and testimonies received since the implementation of this pilot project, we can see that **the program meets an existing need** in 0-5-year-olds. We want to highlight the remarkable interest and collaboration of our internal and external partners. We will soon be able to take stock of the pilot project for the Haute-Côte-Nord sector and look for adjustments, if necessary, **for an eventual broader deployment**.

# REPORTING LABORATORY INCIDENTS

In an effort to reduce situations where two reports are made for a single event and to ensure that accidents with levels of severity of D and higher are systematically disclosed to users, the following directives now apply:

- Incidents and accidents without consequences that happened in clinical laboratories no longer need to be reported with the AH-223-1 form, because the system for managing non-conformities in place in laboratories allows for the adequate management of several risk situations.
  - in order
- ⇒ Only accidents with consequences must be reported with the AH-223-1 form, in order to ensure adequate disclosure to the user.
- ⇒ All sentinel events must be reported with the AH-223-1 form.

# **OMÉGA: WORKPLACE SAFETY TOOLS!**

The topic of prevention and safety management in situations of violence is broad, complex and important for workers and managers of the health and social services network. This is one of the reasons that led many directions to work together to offer several Oméga training sessions on the territory.



The Oméga training program aims to help health care workers develop skills and intervention methods to ensure their own safety and that of others in situations of aggressiveness. Since January 2021, **four training sessions have been offered to 64 workers in the region** (social workers, nurses, intervention officers, educators, maintenance workers, managers, etc.). **Stéphanie Boudreault** worked really hard to organize these training sessions in collaboration with all directions to reach as many people as possible. Two other sessions are scheduled in Sept-Îles in April and one in Fermont in May (32 registrations). The Training department is working on an annual calendar to ensure continuous training throughout the territory.

Here are the comments of two intervention officers in psychiatric settings who received training:

- "This training was extraordinary, very complete and very interesting, both the theory and the physical techniques. The trainers were very interesting. Thank you for allowing me to take part in this training, it will be helpful in all contexts of my life."
- "For me, Oméga is a complete, instructive and reassuring training! These are unique skills that are useful to several people. The trainers are empathetic and compelling! My learnings during this training will be useful in my professional and personal life."


Thank you and bravo to the members of the team who accepted to participate. It is far from easy on a daily basis, and we must innovate to stay motivated. I am really proud of our team!
