MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD OFFICE

A few days ago, the ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux has issued a Ministerial Order to increase protective measures in order to reduce the risk of introducing the virus in certain environments of the network, including recurrent screening for unvaccinated workers. Summary of the measures:

- Workers must provide their employer with proof of having received a COVID-19 vaccine dose.
- Workers who have not received a vaccine dose at least 14 days ago, and those who refuse to provide a proof of vaccination must go through recurrent preventive screening.
- Workers who refuse to go through screening must, when possible, be reassigned to duties within their job title in an environment that is not targeted by this order.
- Workers who refuse reassignment or for whom reassignment is not possible may not reintegrate work and receive no remuneration.

Workers targeted by this order are those who work in any of the following environments:

- Emergency units, except psychiatric emergency units;
- Intensive care units, except psychiatric intensive care units:
- Clinics specific to COVID-19, including screening, evaluation and vaccination clinics;
- Units identified by an institution as reserved for persons with a positive COVID-19 diagnosis;
- Residential and long-term care centres;
- Other residential units;
- Pneumology units.

The persons targeted by these measures will be contacted in the coming days by a representative of the Health, safety and quality of work life department. For more details, consult the **Ministerial Order**.

ADVERSE EVENTS OUTSIDE THE CARE CONTEXT

Before or after a medical appointment, or once they are officially released, the user becomes a visitor, because they do not, or no longer, receive care or services.

Therefore, any event that happens then must not be declared with the AH-223 form.

Here are examples of situations that should not be declared:

- ⇒ A user who falls in the stairs inside the establishment, on their way to the floor where they have an appointment.
- ⇒ A user who falls on the ice in the parking lot of the establishment after being released.



MEMORANDUM OF THE NURSES OF THE CISSS DE LA CÔTE-NORD



Ahead of the Estates general on the nursing profession, which will take place in May, nurses of the CISSS de la Côte-Nord delivered a <u>memorandum on the future of the nursing practice (French only)</u>. The event is organized by the Ordre des infirmières et infirmiers du Québec (OIIQ).

The recommendations included in the memorandum come from three consultation forums organized by the CISSS de la Côte-Nord, where close to 60 nurses working in various clinical environments in the region voiced their concerns. During these consultations, participants demonstrated their desire to further their skills, provide high quality care to the population, and see the development of their role and their profession be adapted to the reality of a practice in a remote region. The CISSS de la Côte-Nord proudly supports this initiative and highlights the quality of the memorandum, which will deliver the message of nurses from the North Shore to the public and to the highest authorities in the profession.
